### Safety Drills:

Lakehead Public Schools is in the process of reviewing and updating safety practices for all our schools. Throughout the months of September, October and early November, Five Mile will be conducting 3 fire drills and one lockdown practice at the school. If you happen to be in the building during one of these practices, you are expected to participate with all students, staff and visitors. Should we experience emergency in which we need to evacuate our school, North McIntyre Recreation Center is our alternate safe location.

### ALLERGY ALERT AND MEDICAL FORM UPDATES!

A friendly reminder: No Nuts/Tree Nuts or Nut products at school please!

Forms for current students who require special medical considerations were sent home last spring. New students will receive these forms upon registration. Students who require Epi Pen and Asthma puffers must have updated forms 1 and 2, as well as their Grab and Go Emergency Medical Management Plans, reviewed and updated each school year. If you require additional copies of those forms, please contact the school as soon as possible. As reminder, any student requiring an Epi Pen for anaphylaxis is always required to have their Epi Pen on them while at the school. Please contact the school for a website link to acquire a belt or shoulder pouch for safekeeping.

### **BUS SAFETY:**

Every Fall, bus evacuation drills are completed to remind/inform students on evacuation protocol. It is the school bus driver's role to perform the evacuation drill as it gives them the practice required along with their students. It is important that all students, not just those who rely on bus transportation to get to school every day, participate in the evacuation drills, and view the video, as it is likely that



all students will ride a school bus on educational trips or to extra-curricular activities at some point in the school year. Our drill will occur within the first few weeks of October.

Users may borrow a maximum of three titles at a time and choose a lending period of one, two, or three weeks for each title borrowed. At the end of the lending period, titles automatically expire.
